
The Senate considered and approved the proposed guideline to be incorporated completely in existing UG Rules and Regulations.

However, in addition to that, committee recommended that the proposed Special Advisor suggested in the agenda for academically weak students may be appointed from outside, from a professional organization.

Moreover, to resolve the non- Academic problems faced by students, a professional, non – academic counselor may also be appointed by the Institute for regular interaction with such students. That professional counselor may be under the jurisdiction of Office of Dean Student Welfare.

Advising Scheme for Students under Non- Academic Grounds:

- (a) The students on mental depression or facing other non-academic social/ personal problems will be put under a professional, non-academic counselor appointed by the Institute.
- (b) Such counselor may be visiting fixed twice or thrice in a week, where special interaction with students may be held .
- (c) Appointed Non-Academic Counselor will work under the jurisdiction of Office of Dean Student Welfare of the Institute.

The Senate considered the submitted agenda but suggested to change the existing rules for Academic Excellence Awards as following:

- (a) Only one student as over all topper must receive the President's Gold Medal and there should not be any repetition in students receiving the President's Gold medal and Director's Gold medal.
- (b) The second topper of a particular branch will receive the Director's Gold Medal and third topper will receive the Institute's Silver Medal.

In view of that, the modified guideline in this regard and revised list of awardees are attached herewith for kind confrontment of Senate. For President's Medal, the proper clearance may be considered from the office of President.

(c) Apart of Academic Excellence Award, Institute may nominate student or students to receive a special award for over all performance considering academic as well as non-academic achievements. The guideline for such award may be set accordingly and may be submitted for consideration in the next Senate meeting. This special award may be named properly as well.

Present criteria for awarding medals:

The medals to the students in the Convocation may be awarded to those students who have completed their B.Tech/M.Tech degree requirements and have satisfied the following eligibility criteria:

- (i) The Minimum CGPA required is 8.5 for the award of any medals or prize.
- (ii) He/She has not failed in any subject at any stage during his/her course of study at the institute till the time of the award.

- (iii) No disciplinary action has been taken against him/her for any offense during his/her co urse of study at the institute prior to the award.
- (iv) He/She has not been punished under examination malpractice and involved in violation of code of conduct at any stage of the course in the Institute/Hall of Residence/ Departmen t/Club etc.

The following medals will be given:

- 1. The President's Gold Medal (PGM): This will be given to the student who secures the high est CGPA in the batch of graduating students amongst all the Branches.
- 2. Director's Gold Medal (DGM): This will be given to the student who secures the highest C GPA in the class of graduating students of a branch.
- 3. Institute Silver Medal (ISM): This will be given to the student who secures the 2nd highest CGPA in the class of graduating students of a branch and not getting President's Gold Medal / Director's Gold Medal.

Tie-Breaking:

- 1. If two or more students attain an equal CGPA upto two decimal points (in addition to satisfying the above mentioned eligibility criteria), all such students will be eligible for the concerned medal(s) i.e. DGM and ISM only.
- 2. If there is a tie for PGM, the following tie breaking rules can be applied:
- (a) The students having earned more number of credits will be awarded the PGM.
- (b) The student with greater count of topmost grade (i.e. A+ grade in case of 2015 batch onwards and Ex grade in case of the previous batches) will be awarded the PGM.
- (c) If the count of topmost grade is also equal, the student with greater count of next topmo st grade (i.e. A grade) will be awarded the PGM. The criterion will be applied for count of al l next topmost grades until the tie is broken.
- (d) If there is still a tie, the student with higher CGPA at the end of 7th semester will be awar ded the PGM. The criterion will be applied for CGPA at the end of immediate previous semes ters (one by one) until the tie is broken.

<u>Updated/Revised (Highlighted)</u> criteria for awarding Director's Gold Medal and Institute Silver Medal:

The criteria for the award of medals as stated above may be followed except for the following proposed changes in the award of the Director's Gold Medal (DGM) and the Institute Sil ver Medal (ISM). The changes are highlighted in the following:

Director's Gold Medal (DGM): This will be given to the student who secures the highest CGP A in the class of graduating students of a branch except for the branch from which the student will get the President's Gold Medal. The branch from which the student has been awarded the President's Gold Medal, the student with the second highest CGPA will be awarded the Director's Gold Medal.

Institute Silver Medal (ISM): This will be given to the student who secures the 2nd highest CGPA in the class of graduating students of a branch except for the branch from which the student will get the President's Gold Medal. The branch from which the student has been

awarded the President's Gold Medal, the student with the third highest CGPA will be awarded the Institute Silver Medal.

The revised list of students eligible for 'Academic Excellence Award' as per the revised criteria proposed above is enclosed as an Annexure I for kind consideration and approval please.
